

2. What is meant by the statement, "I believe there is a church"? What does the Roman Catholic Church teach regarding this confession?
3. Why do we say that the designation, "congregation" is more biblical than "church" to describe what a local church is?

4. Why does the Bible also speak of the church as "the called"?
5. Why do we call it a "holy church"? How do we see that proven in the Bible?
6. What do the terms "catholic" or "universal" mean regarding the church? How is that shown in
the Bible?
7. Why do we say that the church is "Christian"? What is the relationship between the Lord Jesus Christ and the church?
8. What is the duty of the church in the world, according to the Bible? How can she fulfill this task?

9. What is the "visible church"? and what is the "invisible church"?
10. What is the relationship between the spiritual kingdom of Jesus Christ, and the secular,
earthly powers and kingdoms? What are the specific tasks of the spiritual kingdom of Christ, and the earthly kingdoms of this world? What is the neutral relationship between them?
11. What are the implications of the phrase, "the communion of saints"?
12. How do the apostolic epistles in the New Testament continually admonish Christians to maintain communion with one another?
