Lesson 36

Persecuted by Herod

As a result of the persecution by Saul, the Christian church was scattered abroad. When the number of believers in Antioch increased Barnabas was sent to preach there. As the church increased Barnabas went find Saul, in Tarsus, to join him there. The disciples were first called Christians in Antioch.

During this time King Herod began to persecute the Christians in Judea. He first killed the apostle James and when he saw that this pleased the Jews, he also arrested Peter. He had planned to kill Peter after Easter, but upon the fervent prayer of the Church, the Lord delivered Peter in a miraculous way. How often do we pray without ceasing, by faith, believing that with God all things are possible.

Map of Paul's Journeys



First Missionary Journey – Start at Antioch in Syria, Seleucia, Salamis and Paphos on island of Cypress, through Perga, Antioch of Pisidia, Iconium, Lystra, Derbe and back through Lystra, Iconium, Antioch, Perga to Antioch in Syria.

Second Missionary Journey – Starting at Antioch in Syria, to Derbe, Lystra, on to Troas, sailed to Philippi, to Thessalonica, Berea, on to Athens and Corinth, then sailed to Ephesus before going to Jerusalem.

Third Missionary Journey – Started at Antioch in Syria, visited Derbe, Lystra, Iconium, Antioch of Pisidia before going to Ephesus, then from Troas sailed to Phillipi and on to Corinth before going to Jerusalem.
