## Lesson 101

## Joel and the Day of the LORD

Joel, chapters 1 through 3

#### **Memory Verse**

"And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh; and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions."

Joel 2:28

#### Who Was Joel?

The name Joel means "the LORD is God." We know very little about the prophet Joel. We read that his father's name was Pethuel. We do not read when it was that Joel prophesied. Because no names of kings are mentioned, some believe he prophesied during the time of queen Athaliah and the high priest Jehoiada. Others believe he preached much later, after the Jews returned from captivity.

#### A Dreadful Judgment

The prophecy of Joel begins with a vivid description of a dreadful scene. It is as if a hurricane has swept across the land and destroyed everything. Nothing is left of the beautiful fields of wheat, the vineyards, and the fruit trees. There is sorrow everywhere. Husbandmen and vinedressers are astonished at the devastation. Priests mourn because people have no sacrifice to offer. The herds and flocks and beasts of the field groan and cry unto God. Then Joel begins to describe what has caused this destruction. A well organized army has overrun the country of Judah. There were so many of them that they darkened the sunlight. They caused a dreadful sound like the rumbling of thousands of chariots and the crackling of a huge fire. No amount of soldiers and armed guards were able to stop the invaders from scaling the city walls, rushing through the streets and entering people's homes by thousands and millions. Who were they? The dreadful invaders who had caused such destruction were huge swarms of locusts. Locust plagues struck fear and terror in the hearts of people who experienced them. In two days, the locusts were able to destroy enough food for half a million people. Before the swarms flew off, they laid millions of eggs which soon hatched, and their larvae ate anything the locusts had left.

At the same time of the locust plague, there was a bad drought. A famine threatened the people of Judah. It is no wonder that Joel cried out, "Gird yourselves, and lament, ye priests: howl, ye ministers of the altar...For the meat offering and the drink offering is withholden from the house of your God" (Joel 1:13). Even the temple service, which pointed to Christ, could no longer continue.

The prophet Joel realized that this dreadful judgment foreshadowed an even greater judgment, which is "the day of the LORD," the judgment day when all the earth will be summoned for judgment. This day will be ushered in by dreadful signs in the sky and in the earth. Joel called out to the people of Judah, "The day of the Lord is great and very terrible; and who shall abide it?" (Joel 2:11). Then Joel called out to his people, "Therefore also now, saith the LORD, turn ye even to me with all your heart, and with fasting, and with weeping, and with mourning: and rend your heart, and not your garments, and turn unto the LORD your God: for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and of great kindness, and repenteth him of the evil" (Joel 2:12 & 13).

#### **A Great Restoration**

God blessed the preaching of Joel. Suddenly the tone of the book of Joel changes. Upon the people's repentance, Joel begins to pronounce great blessings and precious promises. The enemy shall be driven away. Gentle showers will come down upon the land, and the threshing floors and the wine fats shall be filled to overflowing. Divinely inspired, Joel may look far in the future. In Joel 2:28–32, we read a promise of a great pouring out of the Holy Spirit upon all flesh. Peter, in his sermon to the astonished Jews at Pentecost, leaves us in no doubt that the wonderful outpouring of the Holy Spirit they were witnessing was the fulfillment of this prophecy. Thankfully, Pentecost was only the beginning of the mighty works of the Holy Spirit among all nations. Now that we have the complete Bible, the Holy Spirit uses the Word of God rather than dreams and visions to renew hearts and minds of sinners. If you have ever heard God's voice speaking to you from his Word, you know that the effect is no less powerful!
