Lesson 12

Melchizedek

Genesis chapter 14

Memory Verse

"And Melchizedek king of Salem brought forth bread and wine: and he was the priest of the most high God."

Genesis 14:18

Melchizedek

When Abraham returned from delivering Lot from captivity, he was met by a man named Melchizedek. Because so few things are said about Melchizedek in the Bible, it might appear that he was not an important figure. His name only appears this once in the book of Genesis, and his interaction with Abram takes up only three verses. By comparison, Abram or Abraham appears 200 times in the book of Genesis and is the focus of over 234 verses. But if you think Melchizedek is not important, you would be mistaken

We should remember that there is not a word in the Bible that is unimportant. Remember what Paul writes to Timothy, "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable" (2 Timothy 3:16). Melchizedek is an important figure. He is said to be the king of Salem, which was later named Jerusalem. Not only is Melchizadek a king, but he is also a priest of the one true God, in a land known for paganism.

A Type of Christ

Melchizedek is a type, or a picture of the Lord Jesus Christ. Consider the following:

- Melchizedek is said in these verses to be "king of Salem, which means "king of peace." Jesus Christ is the "Prince of Peace" (Isaiah 9:6).
- The name "Melchizedek" means "king of righteousness." Jesus Christ is King; he sits upon the heavenly throne in heaven, ruling and reigning in righteousness, as foretold by Isaiah, "Behold, a king shall reign in righteousness" (Isaiah 32:1).
- Melchizedek was also a priest, a king/priest, who blessed Abram. The Lord Jesus Christ is also a King/Priest. He is our "great high priest that is passed into the heavens...[therefore] let

us hold fast our profession. Let us therefore come boldly unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need" (Hebrews 4:14, 16).

Melchizedek provided bread and wine to Abram and his men to nourish and stengthen them
after the battle, which means that he had offered a sacrifice and prayed to God for Abram's
success. Jesus Christ nourishes and strengthens his people by his Word, and by the sacrament
of the Lord's Supper, providing bread and wine to show his sacrifice of himself on the cross
to pay the penalty of our sins.
