

Lesson 7

The Coming Judgment: A Way of Escape

Genesis 6:9 through Genesis 8:19

Memory Verse

"And the LORD said unto Noah, Come thou and all thy house into the ark; for thee have I seen righteous before me in this generation.""

Genesis 7:1

A Coming Judgment

The descrution of the world by the flood is a picture of the judgment that shall take place in the last days. All those who set their hearts against the Lord will perish. Although this is a just end that comes upon a rebellious people, it is also a sad picture. Many generations had passed since Adam transgressed. In all those years, God was "striving with man" (Genesis 6:3). However, as God was calling sinners to himself, they rebelled more and more. The same is true today. Jesus Christ commanded that the gospel be preached to every creature. Sadly, many who hear the preaching today also rebel against it.

A Way of Escape

The coming judgment was a terrible thing. However, God did not destroy every person. "Noah found grace in the eyes of the LORD" (Genesis 6:8). God made a plan, which he told to Noah. Noah was to build an ark. Within the ark, Noah, his family, and the animals of the earth would find a place of safety from the storm that was to cover the whole earth.

Jesus Christ—A Place of Safety

As God was gracious to Noah, he is also gracious today. He told Noah to build an ark to escape the coming judgment. Today, through the Bible, God tells sinners about a way to escape the final judgment. This way is through his Son. The ark is a representation of the salvation to be found in Jesus Christ. Consider the following comparisons:

It was God's plan to save Noah by the ark.	It is God's plan to save sinners by his Son.
Everyone outside the ark was destroyed, while everyone inside the ark was saved.	Everyone outside of Christ will be eternally condemned, while everyone inside Christ will have eternal life.
There was only one door by which a person could enter into the ark	There is only one door by which a sinner can be reconciled to God—Jesus Christ.
It was by faith that Noah built and entered the ark.	It is by faith in Jesus Christ that a sinner escapes the final judgment.
