

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

<u>Scripture Text</u>

"Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven .--Matthew 6:10b

Key Points

1. Introduction.

- a. One common interpretation: deny ourselves that God's will would be done in our hearts.
- b. Real meaning: that we and other people learn to do the will of God positively.

c. Praying God's will: that we would love him with all our heart, all our soul, all our mind, and all our strength.

- 2. God's will be done in heaven.
 - a. The meaning of "in heaven."
 - b. Those who are in heaven.
 - c. Obey God willingly and faithfully, like the angels in heaven.
 - d. The Lord Jesus Christ gives us an example of living according to God's will.
- 3. God's will be done in earth.
 - a. God's will in our daily lives and in our spiritual life.
 - b. A renewed will by the work of the Holy Spirit.
 - c. An Intercessory prayer.
 - d. "The LORD loveth the gates of Zion more than all the dwellings of Jacob."
 - e. Specific instruction for private prayer.
 - 1) Strive in prayer.
 - 2) Pray with expectation and zeal.
 - 3) Be particular in prayer.
 - 4) Boldness in our prayer.

f. Especially pastors should pray that sinners would do the will of God.

g. Examples from the Scripture: Samuel, Jeremiah, Hezekiah, the apostles, Peter, Paul.

Review Questions

8. What other practical instructions are given us in this lecture? What are some Bible verses which exhort us to have a good prayer life?

9. Rev. Gerald Procee said, "Especially pastors should pray that sinners would learn to do the will of God." Is intercessory prayer the pastor's most important work?

10. Please look up the Bible passages about the examples of intercessory prayer that are given in this lecture. Read the accounts and meditate on the stories. What do these witnesses teach you about the life of prayer?
