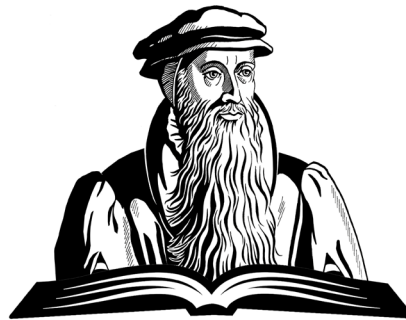

# For Thine is the Kingdom, the Power, and the Glory

### Scripture Text

*"For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever."* —Matthew 6, verse 13b

### Key Points

1. Introduction – the conclusion of the Lord's Prayer.
  - a. This is not a petition, but a confession of adoring and glorifying God.
  - b. Jesus teaches his disciples to bow in the dust before the glory of God.
2. Thine is the kingdom – this great kingdom belongs to God.
  - a. God has given this kingdom to his Son. The Lord Jesus is King forever.
  - b. All other kingdoms will fall, but this kingdom will last forever.
  - c. God's kingdom ultimately will consist of a new heaven and a new earth.
3. Thine is the power - all power in existence originates from God.
  - a. Power is an essential perfection of God.
  - b. The power of God is available to you, through faith in Jesus Christ.
  - c. By his power, God saves lost sinners; and he is willing to save.
  - f. God's power is seen in his Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, the Savior of sinners.
  - g. We should think about this great and mighty power of God when we pray.
4. Thine is the glory – all glory must be given to God.
  - a. God made all things to his own glory.
  - b. The Lord Jesus always promoted the glory of God.

- c. God works all things to his glory.
  - d. Prayer is ultimately all about the glory and honor of God.
  - e. We should pray that our lives would bring glory to God.
5. God is glorified by thanksgiving. We must remember to give thanks to God for everything.
- a. Many examples in the Bible of giving thanks to God.
  - b. There are many reasons to give thanks to God.
6. For ever – the worship, adoration, and thanksgiving we give God today will one day be made perfect in heaven when we will give God the glory forever and ever.
