Scripture Text

"Though the LORD be high, yet hath he respect unto the lowly: but the proud he knoweth afar off."—Psalm 138:6

Key Points

- 1. Personal prayer is not easy; you will meet with much opposition.
- 2. The evil one will give us sinful thoughts while we pray.
 - a. The devil tempts us to think that God will not hear us because of our sin.
- 3. God hears the prayers of those who come with a penitent heart.
 - a. Scripture shows that God hears the prayers of even unconverted people.
 - b. God hears the prayers of little children who have a simple faith.
 - c. God will hear the unbeliever who prays for conversion and faith.
- 4. Daily labor can keep us very busy and tempt us to neglect prayer.
 - a. We must not allow our daily labors to interfere with the spiritual work of prayer.
 - b. We must not be lazy about the work of prayer.
- 5. Ignorance of the nature of God can be a hindrance to prayer.
 - a. We need the knowledge of God's mercy, his bountiful goodness, kindness, and love.
- 6. The evil one will try to distance us from the Lord through temptation.
 - a. We must examine ourselves daily to stay close to the Lord.
- 7. Worldliness in our lives can be a hindrance to prayer.
- 8. The evil one will put thoughts into our minds to keep us from praying.

- 9. If we sin and do not confess it to God, that can hinder our prayers.
- 10. If we think that God does not answer our prayers, it can hinder us from praying.
 - a. God's timing is perfect, and he does all things for our good.
- 11. There can be many struggles in prayer life.
 - a. James Fraser, a missionary, had great struggles in prayer.
- 12. Certain characteristics are needed in our prayer life.
 - a. Humility, faith, love, and patience.
