

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Scripture Text

"And thou shalt make an altar of shittim wood, five cubits long, and five cubits broad; the altar shall be foursquare: and the height thereof shall be three cubits. And thou shalt make the horns of it upon the four corners thereof: his horns shall be of the same: and thou shalt overlay it with brass. And thou shalt make his pans to receive his ashes, and his shovels, and his basons, and his fleshhooks, and his firepans: all the vessels thereof thou shalt make of brass. And thou shalt make for it a grate of network of brass; and upon the net shalt thou make four brasen rings in the four corners thereof. And thou shalt put it under the compass of the altar beneath, that the net may be even to the midst of the altar. And thou shalt make staves for the altar, staves of shittim wood, and overlay them with brass. And the staves shall be put into the rings, and the staves shall be upon the two sides of the altar, to bear it. Hollow with boards shalt thou make it: as it was shewed thee in the mount, so shall they make it.—Exodus 27, verses 1 to 8

c. The word "altar" in Hebrew means "high place," relating that Jesus would be lifted up.

6. What materials were used to build the Brazen Altar? What is the spiritual message in using both these materials? How does this picture the glory of Jesus Christ?
7. In what ways did the Brazen Altar point to the coming Messiah, the Lord Jesus Christ?
8. Why was it necessary for the Lord Jesus to have a human nature and a divine nature?
9. The four horns on the Brazen Altar pointed in four directions. What spiritual truth can we learn from that?

10. What is the literal meaning of the Hebrew word for "altar"? How do Jesus' words in .	John
3:14 relate to this?
