

Scripture Text

"And thou shalt make a candlestick of pure gold: of beaten work shall the candlestick be made: his shaft, and his branches, his bowls, his knops, and his flowers, shall be of the same. And six branches shall come out of the sides of it; three branches of the candlestick out of the one side, and three branches of the candlestick out of the other side: three bowls made like unto almonds, with a knop and a flower in one branch; and three bowls made like almonds in the other branch, with a knop and a flower: so in the six branches that come out of the candlestick. And in the candlestick shall be four bowls made like unto almonds, with their knops and their flowers. And there shall be a knop under two branches of the same, and a knop under two branches of the same, and a knop under two branches of the same, according to the six branches that proceed out of the candlestick. Their knops and their branches shall be of the same: all it shall be one beaten work of pure gold. And thou shalt make the seven lamps thereof: and they shall light the lamps thereof, tht they may give light over against it. And the tongues thereof, and the snuffdishes thereof, shall be of pure gold. Of a talent of pure gold shall he make it, with all these vessels. And look that thou make them after their pattern, which was shewed thee in the mount."—Exodus 25, verses 31 through 40

Key Points

- 1. Description of the Lampstand.
 - a. "Lampstand" in Hebrew means "light-bearer," lit by the finest olive oil, not wax candles.
 - b. Made from 90 lbs. of pure gold, beaten out from one solid piece of gold.
- c. Three branches on either side of a central stem, a bowl on top of each, like an almond tree, a symbol of hope and resurrection.
 - e. The oil had to be beaten from unripe olives so it was pure, burned bright, and never smoked.
 - f. The lamps must continuously burn day and night. So, the wick was trimmed and oil replenished twice daily, morning and evening.

2. The glory of Christ is seen in the Lampstand.
3. The Lampstand branches connected to the stem is a symbol of the church connected to Christ.
4. The Holy Spirit is pictured in the oil of the Lampstand.
5. Lampstand points to our duties as believers.
6. The priest's daily care of the Lampstand points to the believer's need for daily prayer.
