



**Honor God's Authority** 

### **Key Text:**

"Honour thy father and thy mother: that thy days may be long upon the land which the LORD thy God giveth thee."—Exodus 20, verse 12

#### Summary:

In this lecture, we learn about the first commandment of the second table of the law. Paul says that the Fifth Commandment is the first commandment with a promise. It's not only a law pertaining to family life, for although the family unit is very important, the commandment is for the well-being of our social life. By this commandment, God also shows his will to us concerning those who bear authority and those who under authority.
