

Lesson 16

Faithless Abraham – Faithful God

Genesis 20

Memory Verse

Now therefore restore the man his wife; for he is a prophet, and he shall pray for thee, and thou shalt live: and if thou restore her not, know thou that thou shalt surely die, thou, and all that are thine.

Genesis 20:7

Faithless Abraham

It is a remarkable thing we read in Genesis 20. Here we find Abraham deceiving the king of Gerar. He gave the king to believe that Sarah was his sister and not his wife. What is remarkable is that this is not the first time Abraham had resorted to deception. In an earlier chapter, he had used the same tactics while in Egypt. And we are told that he had conspired with Sarah to tell this same story in “every place” they came (Genesis 20:13).

Often when men write books about those they admire, they highlight the good and hide the bad. God in His Word does no such thing. Abraham is a child of God. The sins of Abraham, by faith, are covered by the precious blood of the Lamb – the Lord Jesus Christ. However, God does not blot out the record of Abraham’s sins from the Bible. They are there for all to read. Why, if the sins of God’s people are covered, does God record them for all to read? God records these things, so that we may profit from them – “All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness” (II Timothy 3:16).

What lesson may we learn from the unfaithfulness of Abraham? We may learn what Solomon learned when he wrote, “For there is not a just man upon earth, that doeth good, and sinneth not” (Ecclesiastes 7:20).

God’s Faithfulness

How sad that Abraham forgot the admonishment he received in Egypt! How sad that Abraham forgot that the Lord had kept his wife from Pharaoh! How sad that Abraham forgot the words God had spoken to him after Abraham delivered Lot from Chedorlaomer! – “I am thy shield, and thy exceeding great reward” (Genesis 15:1). Why is God faithful in the face of Abraham’s failings? Thankfully, it is to impress upon the Christian that the ground of salvation is not in what man has done or does, but in “the gifts and calling of God [which] are without

repentance” (Romans 11:29) There is no greater ground of confidence than the free and sovereign grace of God, in Jesus Christ.
