

Memorization

Question 57: *Which is the fourth commandment?*

Answer: The fourth commandment is, "Remember the sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work: but the seventh day is the sabbath of the LORD thy God: in it thou shalt not do any work, thou, nor thy son, nor thy daughter, thy manservant, nor thy maidservant, nor thy cattle, nor thy stranger that is within thy gates: for in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that in them is, and rested the seventh day: wherefore the LORD blessed the sabbath day, and hallowed it."

Question 58: What is required in the fourth commandment?

Answer: The fourth commandment requireth the keeping holy to God such set times as he hath appointed in his word; expressly one whole day in seven, to be a holy sabbath to himself.

Question 59: Which day of the seven hath God appointed to be the weekly sabbath? **Answer:** From the beginning of the world to the resurrection of Christ, God appointed the seventh day of the week to be the weekly sabbath; and the first day of the week ever since, to continue to the end of the world, which is the Christian sabbath.

8. What great world-changing event happened on the first day of the week, when the Lord Jesus Christ rested from his humiliation and from his work of redeeming his people?
9. How do the New Testament Scriptures prove to us that the sabbath day was changed from the seventh day to the first day of the week after the resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ?
10. Why is it called "the Lord's Day"? Where does that name come from? What does it mean?
